  - But no product is really satisfactory
  - And they all work differently: API's, metadata
  - Bad user experience
- It's a shame most interesting things aren't really book-like or simple images
  - Folds (multiple paths)
  - Scrolls (tiling long images)
  - Large sheets (zooming and panning)
  - No rectangular (masking)
  - Fragmented (multiple images)
