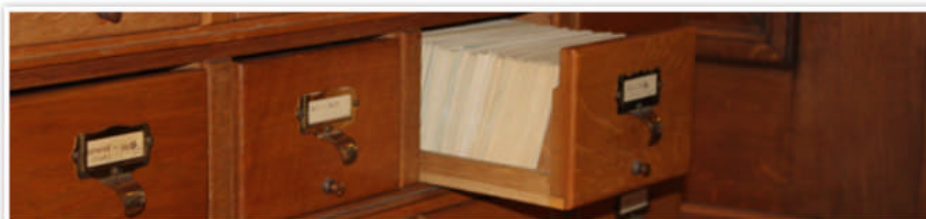

The most comprehensive existing catalogue of seventeenth-century manuscript correspondence in the Bodleian Library is a fifty-two drawer index-card file located in the Selden End of the historic [Duke Humfrey's Library](#).

Compiled in the early- to mid-twentieth century by Bodleian staff, this catalogue provides summaries of around **48,000** MS letters from the sixteenth, seventeenth, and eighteenth centuries preserved in 487 volumes of manuscripts in the Bodleian, including material from the Rawlinson
