The most comprehensive existing catalogue of seventeenth-century manuscript correspondence in the Bodleian Library is a fifty-two drawer index-card file located in the Selden End of the historic Duke Humfrey's Library.

Compiled in the early- to mid-twentieth century by Bodleian staff, this catalogue provides summaries of around 48,000 MS

letters from the sixteenth, seventeenth, and eighteenth centuries preserved in 487 volumes of manuscripts in the Bodleian, including material from the Rawlinson
